- Analyze the current culture of safety in a workplace or clinical environment.
- Identify gaps or risks in safety protocols or leadership behaviors.

Tips for Success:

- Interview colleagues or review incident reports to identify real issues.

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NURS FPX 6620 Assessment 1: Root-Cause Analysis and Safety Improvement Plan

Course Overview: NURS FPX 6620 – *Leadership and Management for Nurse Executives* – focuses [NURS FPX 6620 Assessment 2](#) on high-level administrative and strategic thinking in healthcare organizations.

Assessment 1 Objective: Students conduct a **root-cause analysis (RCA)** of a sentinel event (such as medication errors, patient falls, or surgical complications) and develop a **comprehensive safety improvement plan**.

Key Tasks:

- Select or create a scenario involving a sentinel event.
- Conduct a detailed RCA using tools like the fishbone diagram or 5 Whys.
- Identify underlying systemic issues (e.g., staffing, training, communication).
- Propose an actionable plan with stakeholder engagement, budget considerations, and evaluation metrics.

Tips for Success:

- Focus on system flaws, not individual blame.
 - Include interdisciplinary perspectives—consider how administrators, RNs, and support staff contribute to outcomes.
 - Use models like PDSA (Plan-Do-Study-Act) to structure your improvement strategy.
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NURS FPX 6620 Assessment 2: Developing an Organizational Scorecard

Assessment 2 Objective: This task challenges students to develop a **balanced scorecard** for a

healthcare organization, which measures performance across various domains like patient care, financial health, internal processes, and learning and growth.

Key Tasks:

- Choose or design a healthcare organization (real or fictional).
- Create a balanced scorecard with 4–5 strategic goals in each domain.
- Define specific, measurable indicators for each goal.
- Align scorecard metrics with the organization's mission, vision, and values.

Tips for Success:

- Think like an executive nurse leader—what data do you need to drive decisions?
 - Link goals to broader quality initiatives (e.g., Magnet recognition, CMS standards).
 - Make sure metrics are actionable and relevant—avoid vague KPIs.
